Thanks for the email. We're happy to sign the proposed Applied GIS certificate.

From the library "side" of the curriculum, the proposal is fine— although we are concerned with the site license for ESRI GIS, Community Analyst, and Business Analyst software (listed at \$4500). In her work with students using GIS, Business Librarian Ann Fiegen has noted ESRI's credit model for generating reports is already limited at our current level of use, and this certificate would certainly lead to increased usage.

Perhaps Ann or Allen Risley (copied) could recommend the level of license we would need for anticipated growth in use.
