

VI. President's Report, Alexander Gonzalez:

César Chavez bill passed and will be celebrated on his birthday March 31st. Minor adjustments to the calendar will be made, because of the additional day off. Bettina Huber, Director of Institutional Studies conducted a study focusing on ethnicity that included staff, faculty, and students. The study concluded that 54% of faculty on campus are women compared to 22% system wide. There has been a steady increase of Latino students' enrollment 18.5% compared to last year 17.7%. African American population has shown no increase. President Gonzalez suggested that since 1992 there has been a steady decline in minority group hiring among faculty. T. Allison stated that Friday, November 10th, was the deadline for the first draft on Action Plan Task. The search committee for the Vice President for Academic Affairs/ Provost will start reviewing applications in late January early February. In March, the final candidates will then visit the campus and by the end of March early April there should be a final decision.

VII. VPAA Report, Pat Worden:

The enrollment target for CSUSM next year is 5160 FTES (60 more than requested). The Chancellor's office believes we can handle more enrollment. Year Round Operations (YRO) will be conducting a forum on November 16th with each of the eight-team leaders presenting. YRO website is available. Accountability #11 on faculty Research & Scholarship was requested by the Chancellor's office. Each campus has also been asked to submit achievement goals for key performance areas and indicators for the academic years 2002-03 and 2004-05. The deadline for these goals is March 5th. The request will be agendized for the next available EC meeting.

VIII. Associated Student Inc.: Humberto Garcia, Jr.

The ASI 2nd Annual Holiday drive will be this Thursday, November 16th. On November 18th, CSUSM MEChA will be hosting their 3rd Annual High School Conference to over 300 hundred high school students. Garcia suggested that the Senate consider student needs when looking for ways to maximize the use of classrooms (e.g., Friday offerings may post a hardship).
