RE: University Hour

In the spirit of shared governance, Associated Students Inc. (ASI) has been working collaboratively with students, staff, faculty, and administrators to implement a University Hour at Cal State San Marcos. The installation of University Hour will allow time for student organization meetings, group academic advising, study groups, co-curricular programs, special events and campus community forums, among others. The National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) results indicate that Cal State San Marcos students cite lack of co-curricular engagement as a main reason for leaving our campus. University Hour will also allow Cal State San Marcos to actively address our low retention rates by providing opportunities for the entire campus community to engage all students in co-curricular programming.

As the University Strategic Priorities are unveiled to the campus community, discussion has developed around high-impact, low-budget items as it relates to the fulfillment of these priorities at Cal State San Marcos. Thus, this is the perfect time to implement University Hour. University Hour will undoubtedly promote the newly developed University Strategic Priorities of Student Life, Campus Climate, Educational Equity, Community Partnership, and Academic Excellence by affording the campus community the opportunity to actively engage in activities, committee meetings and open dialogue. Therefore, the objectives outlined within these priorities will be achieved. Furthermore, the budget impact will be minimal and the effect on campus community will be great.

University Hour, which will strengthen our students' college experience, will also serve the Cal State San Marcos Mission by empowering students to be active participants in building a community through co-curricular engagement while promoting Cal State San Marcos Core Values. It will also allow ASI to fully realize its Core Values of advocacy, communication and vision by providing opportunities to speak with students, inform them on issues affecting their education and respond to the needs of a diverse student body.

California State University Los Angeles, California State University Monterey Bay, and California State Polytechnic University, Pomona are the three CSU campuses that have a University Hour in place. Additionally, Mira Costa College, our local educational partner, also has a University Hour. Campus Leadership, from each of the institutions we have spoken to, have unequivocally stated that University Hour has been immensely beneficial as an essential time for their respective campus communities to connect, develop, mature and grow. By building student life and campus climate through programs and events, student organization meetings, study groups, etc, University Hour helps current and potential students understand that at Cal State San Marcos, we are committed to "Building Vital Communities".

We have compiled background information on University Hour and had conversations with all campus constituents on the subject. The Associated Students, Inc. Board of Directors formally proposes that a University Hour be implemented between the hours of 2:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m., Tuesday(s) & Thursday(s) to be realized in the Academic Schedule in Fall 2006.
