IV. **President's Report: Karen Haynes** Haynes noted that many excellent adjunct faculty were nominated for the new president's award, and she expects to announce the awardee next week. Twelve MPPs were nominated for the Zomalt award, which will go this year to Marion Reid; Juan Necochea is the Brakebill award recipient;

- V. Provost's Report: Emily Cutrer Cutrer was unable to attend.
- VI. ASCSU Report: Brodowsky/Montanari Montanari will attend an interim FAC meeting this week.
- VII. CFA Report: Lance Newman The faculty hearing panel has been formed and will be electing a chair; no grievances are in process. The fall assembly meeting focused on three goals: increased state funding for the CSU, faculty workload, and increasing diversity among faculty, staff and students. Fair share fees will increase to the amount of regular dues; faculty may opt out of paying the increased portion of the fee. Our campus membership statistics are: 72% of tenure-track, 52% of lecturers with two or more classes, and 15% of lecturers with one class.
- VIII. ASI Report: Felipe Zañartu Zañartu provided an update on ASI's activities and positions.

X. Old Business

- A. APC Community Service Learning Policy Yoshii introduced this item. Changes suggested in November have been made. A discussion took place concerning the title and nature of the Informed Consent Waiver form. It was pointed out that the language of the paragraph beginning on line 35 is contradictory. It was suggested that lines 37 to 41be removed and referred to Risk Management staff, and that they consider the forms used by Senior Experience within CoBA. The chair acted to suspend the item to the February agenda.

XI. New Business

A. UCC Option in Management Information Systems Hansen noted that UCC has reviewed the option which replaces the High Technology Management option, with one new course added. The catalog description has been updated to include information on how this option is distinguished from the major in Computer Science. Watson noted that technology and staffing expenses will be covered by Group II monies.

- **B. GEC Language Other Than English Requirement** A revision was provided via e-mail. There are no substantive changes to the 1992 Foreign Language Requirement, but the requirement has been updated to reflect current practice. Comments are to be directed to Whittlesey.
- **C. FAC Sabbatical Leave Policy** Read noted that a minor language change is proposed as clarification of current practice, which is to make receipt of a sabbatical leave contingent upon achieving tenure.
- **D. EC MBA Fee Differential Resolution** A handout was provided and senators were asked to insert the word "fee" toward the end of line 8. Brodowsky noted that the proposed \$210 per unit differential is the result of Business deans systemwide conferring on the challenges inherent in hiring Business faculty. ASCSU senators had mixed reactions to the proposal and will ask the Board of Trustees to work on alternatives other than a fee differential. This resolution speaks in favor of that statewide resolution. Guseman noted that the proposal seeks to ensure the CSU's ability to provide a quality business education to its students. A suspension of the rules was requested. Zañartu noted that this appears to be a tax on students and expressed concern about a trend developing. Gonzalez noted we are not receiving the level of funding at the state level necessary to provide a quality education, and that alternative means are necessarily being sought.
