BLP welcomes Zach Morrison as the ASI representative to BLP. It had been several years since we had a student representative, and are pleased to have his input.

BLP reviewed the P-form for the Option in Border Studies as part of the Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies. Recommendations were sent to the Academic Senate which approved the Option at the October meeting. BLP has begun review of a proposed Bachelor of Arts in Child and Adolescent Development (CHAD).

All new course offerings must be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) starting Fall 2008. BLP decided to look at the Executive Order because compliance for any new course could have budget implications. Linda Scott joined BLP members at the September 17 meeting and walked us through the implications of ADA compliance. We covered memos from the Chancellor's Office as well as CSUSM's Instructional Materials Accessibility Plan. She explained that the San Marcos Faculty Accessibility Representatives (FARS) are available to help faculty meet compliance.

Kathleen Watson represents BLP on a task force appointed by the Provost to formulate recommendations for the budget process in Academic Affairs. She and Jennifer Jeffries brought suggestions from BLP to the task force, including joint meetings between BLP and the Academic Affairs Leadership Council (AALC), at specific points in the budget timeline, to confer on program development plans and their resource implications.

BLP provided input to the WASC Educational Effectiveness Review Essay on Theme 1: Academic Master Planning. Several BLP members assisted Jennifer Jeffries in fielding questions at the October 30 Town Hall during which the essay was discussed.

General Education Committee (GEC)

GEC continues to work with the GEC Assessment Coordinator, Sharon Hamill, to draft General Education Learning Outcomes. Drafts of Area C (Arts and Humanities) and Area D (Social Sciences) General Education Learning Outcomes have been generated and discussed by the committee. Area representatives are actively soliciting feedback from faculty in their colleagues. A draft for Area B will be discussed by the committee soon. Anyone who is interested in viewing these drafts and/or providing feedback can contact GEC Chair (Yvonne Meulemans, ymeulema@csusm.edu/x4375).

An executive order (EO) detailing a CSU-wide policy on awarding credit for taking AP exams was sent out this summer. GEC is currently reviewing this EO to address any inconsistencies with CSUSM's policy regarding awarding credit for taking AP exams.

A minor change to acceptable CLEP scores for fulfilling the Language Other than English Requirement is being presented as an information item at today's Senate meeting.

Proposals for GE courses continue to be reviewed as they are received.
