V. Discussion items

- **A. APC Independent Study** Aboolian introduced this item which would create a standard process for the approval of independent study courses. Questions/Comments to APC.
- **B.** APC Academic Program Discontinuance Aboolian noted that this revision aims to streamline the process and updates the document to reflect the new academic structure. Questions/Comments to APC.
- C. APC Second Master's Aboolian introduced this item which would provide requirements which must be met in order to attain a second Master's degree within the same discipline as the first. Questions /Comments to APC.

- VI. Chair's report, Wayne Aitken The statewide Senate Chairs group met last week and discussed Cal State Online and the need for more faculty consultation before moving forward; the executive director reports to a board of directors which includes faculty members and our president, among others. LATAC has been asked to develop some expertise on Cal State Online. There was a discussion about presidential searches and it was noted that presidents are more externally focused than in the past and faculty seem to be playing a lesser and lesser role in faculty operations, a trend Aitken hopes we can resist at CSUSM. It was reported that no waivers have been requested to date of the American Institutions requirement. Aitken also reported that the idea to make CSU graduate students ineligible for State University Grants (SUGs) as a cost-saving measure is off the table for the coming academic year. The nomination process for the Brakebill Outstanding Professor award is now open through April 30. NEAC will hold another group of elections for the proposed Constitutional referendum (not enough votes were cast the first time) as well as for some PTC seats (elections which must be contested).
- VII. Vice Chair's report, Jackie Trischman Trischman encouraged Senators to consider running or nominating someone for Vice Chair for AY 12/13.
- VIII. President's Report, Karen Haynes Attending an off-site meeting.
- **IX. Provost's Report, Emily Cutrer** Cutrer encouraged faculty to apply to participate in Campus Connect, a program that exposes each year's cohort to aspects of the campus operations and academic offerings they might not otherwise get to know about. The Faculty Research Celebration last week was very successful and the participants are congratulated; the Chancellor's Office used this event to gather visual material and data for promotional materials about the system's research commitment. The Student Poster Showcase will be held April 26th at the Clarke; thanks to faculty and CUGR. A senator commended the provost and president for their support of research.
- X. VP for Student Affairs Report, Eloise Stiglitz A number of awards ceremonies will be taking place over the next weeks as we celebrate our students' accomplishments. Usage of the student support labs is up 15-30% over last year at this time. This month is Gaypril, and our Pride Center is planning a number of events to celebrate gay pride.
- XI. ASCSU Report, Brodowsky/Meilich Brodowsky's Faculty Affairs Committee met via teleconferencing last week. The ASCSU's proposed constitutional amendment regarding academic freedom has been vetted and cleared by the General Counsel's office. A resolution is under consideration which would call for appropriate levels of faculty input on Cal State Online. Other campuses are currently discussing definitions of "college," "school," etc., and Brodowsky shared with them the definitions most recently approved by our Senate. Elections for new ASCSU officers will take place during the May plenary meeting.
- XII. CFA report, Don Barrett Despite Chancellor's Office press releases inviting CFA back to the bargaining table, CFA is moving forward with its strike authorization vote. Faculty are encouraged to sign a petition supporting the Governor's budget initiative which, if passed, would free up money for the CSU. Without the initiative, the State will face a \$200M budget gap.

LATAC: LATAC's new committee chair, Ian Chan, noted that LATAC meets on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday at 9 a.m., and is reviewing the Cal State Online initiative.
