- **III.** Chair's Report: Rika Yoshii Yoshii noted that the Intellectual Property Task Force has been seated and there is a link to information on the Senate's website. The Graduation Initiative Steering Committee's Discovery Café was attended by about 90 people and information was shared about obstacles to graduation. Yoshii noted that if each faculty member were to spend one minute a day thinking about how to help at-risk students, it could make a big difference. Yoshii asked Senators to monitor the EC agendas and minutes to stay abreast of items under discussion and which will be coming before the Senate. Barsky will address the Senate in November concerning the new Early Start legislation.

- VII. ASCSU Report: Brodowsky/Montanari A plenary meeting was held in September and committees will meet in October. A systemwide effort is underway to collect data regarding research efforts in order to enhance collaborations (FRESCA). Brodowsky reviewed resolutions put forward at the meeting. Academic freedom, affordable textbooks, and the still vacant faculty trustee seat were main topics. Montanari made available a list of current legislation deemed to have an impact on CSU faculty.
- **VIII. CFA Report: Don Barrett** The CFA listserv is now hosted via Google groups; CFA members should have received notice of this. The ASI is sponsoring a rally tomorrow for the nationwide Day to Defend Education; Breuer will be speaking. A phone bank will be set up for encouraging union members across the state to vote. A non-partisan voter education teach-in is planned for October 26.
- **IX. ASI Report, Amanda Riley** Tomorrow's Defend Education event will include a voter registration drive. ASI will be working later in the month to educate students about the candidates and issues on the November ballot. CSSA has not yet had a response from the Governor's office concerning its recommendation for the non-voting student trustee.

BLP Resolution in support of findings and recommendations of Data Reconciliation and Analysis Subcommittee of BLP Oskoorouchi and Aitken described the faculty/administration efforts leading to creation of the FIRMS and SFR reports.
