III. Chair's Report: Rika Yoshii The Senate's website has been updated to include a "Hot Topics" list which will be regularly updated (and will be included on Senate agendas this year as a reminder). There was a discussion concerning whether and how the Senate might respond to the restructuring proposal. The provost has prepared a summary of the responses received to date, and this will be posted on the provost's website. The provost's recommendation concerning the restructuring is due to the president by December 8. Senators expressed

A. FAC Department Level Standards and Additional Material for Temporary Faculty Evaluation Santamaria indicated that no changes had been made since the first reading.

Motion #4 M/S/P (1 abstention) To approve the policy as presented.

B. SAC Faculty Management of Course Records Meilich noted that the suggestion that codes be used instead of names was incorporated into the document; SAC decided against a suggestion that students sign waivers. It was noted that Facilities will shred boxes of documents for a minor fee.

Motion #5 M/S/P (2 opposed; 4 abstentions) To approve the resolution as presented.

C. APC Declaration of Major Aboolian indicated that no changes have been made since the first reading.

Motion #6 M/S/P (4 opposed; 2 abstentions) To approve the resolution as presented.

VII. New Business

A. BLP/UCC Minor in Music Technology Beavers and Fang reviewed their written reports included in the agenda packet.

Motion #7 M/S/D (McDuffie) (23 in favor; 14 opposed; 5 abstentions) To suspend the rules for a first reading.

- **B.** APC Course Repeat Petition policy Aboolian introduced this policy revision which addresses multiple petitions to repeat a single course. Comments included: (1) change language at line 40 to read "Dean or designee;" (2) include language allowing departments to have stricter course repeat policies; (3) clarify that the policy applies to unofficial withdrawals as well as fails; and (4) ensure EMS is aware of the policy or include a specific procedure and form. Additional comments to Aboolian.
- VIII. President's Report: Karen Haynes Haynes wished all a good holiday break
- IX. Provost's Report: Emily Cutrer Cutrer congratulated Natalie Wilson on her talk at the Faculty Research Colloquium. The National Council on Undergraduate Research has selected the CSU as one of two or three systems to participate in an NSF-funded grant and symposium; Cutrer noted the important role VP Gonzalez played in achieving this recognition for the CSU system at large. As of November 30, we are closed for admissions for Fall 2011; however, we are still open for Spring 2011 admissions; the closure of fall admissions is to protect our

impaction status. We currently have about 2,000 applications for spring (including first-time freshmen, lower division transfers, upper division transfers, as well as post-baccs, credential students, and graduate students) and have received about 500 intents to enroll (deposits). On November 29, a group including AALC members and EC members reviewed the more than 60 web comments received to the restructure proposal; a summary of those comments will be posted, along with the colleges' governance responses to the proposal, by December 3.

In response to questions, Cutrer indicated that she is reviewing requests for faculty hires and will be providing authorizations within the next week. An announcement of the upcoming dean searches will appear in *The Chronicle of Higher Education* in the next couple of weeks. She was unable to address a question regarding widely held concerns by faculty and staff that the proposed timeline for restructuring the division is infeasible, but indicated she would respond at a future time, after reviewing the many communications she has received in this regard.
