Campus Policing Resolution

WHEREAS, The current structure of the campus police interaction with the campus community does not allow feedback to reach the campus police in a constructive manner; and

WHEREAS, The current structure of the campus police interaction with the campus community does not allow effective communication of the mission and vision of our campus police; and

WHEREAS, There is a need for collaboration on campus in terms of communicating the successful programs and positive interactions the community has with campus police as well as a need to build a stronger body of evidence that the campus policing culture embodies the goals set forth in the mission and vision statements of the campus police and the university; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Academic Senate of California State University San Marcos requests President Haynes form a task force (seeking the advice of the Senate on composition and scope) by January 13, 2005, to explore the feasibility of a campus community board to be implemented by the President with authority to set and review community policing policy.
