Girl Scout Project - Fall 2020

<u>Objective:</u> Create fun virtual content for Girl Scouts for them to do at home. These will include badges, songs, crafts, and games.

Project Structure:

- Groups of four students
- Each group will be responsible for creating a total of **eight videos and one virtual** guidebook which will include any relevant handouts and links that correspond with your videos
- The eight videos should represent a troop meeting
- We will give you a general outline of the videos, but choose a badge that you are interested in. Be creative and have fun!

• We will have one-on-one check-ins at specific timepoints to give feedback on progress. These check-ins will take place after the completion of each assignment

Video Structure:

- Each series of videos will be a mix of badgework, games, activities, songs, and crafts
- You will chose an age level to work on and a specific badge or petal within that age level
- All videos must be a minimum of five minutes long
- Here are the video requirements for each age level:
 - Daisies:
 - Visit <u>Daisy Badge Explorer</u> and select two petals
 - Video #1: 1st Petal requirement #1
 - Video #2: 1st Petal requirement #2
 - Video #3: 1st Petal requirement #3
 - Video #4: 2nd Petal requirement #1
 - Video #5: 2nd Petal requirement #2
 - Video #6: 2nd Petal requirement #3
 - Video #7: Group song (all group members must participate)
 - Video #8: Craft related to the petal
 - Brownies, Juniors, Cadettes
 - Brownie: Visit <u>Brownie Badge Explorer</u> and select one badge
 - Junior: Visit <u>Junior Badge Explorer</u> and select one badge
 - Cadette: Visit <u>Cadette Badge Explorer</u>
 - Video #1: Badge requirement #1
 - Video #2 Badge requirement #2
 - Video #3: Badge requirement #3
 - Video #4: Badge requirement #4
 - Video #5: Badge requirement #5
 - Video #6: Group song (all group members must participate)
 - Video #7: Craft related to the badge
 - Video #8: Song

Video Requirements:

- Be as engaging as possible. We want to make this a fun and interactive experience for the girls, not school
- Please do the Girl Scout Promise and Law at the beginning of the first video in your series (please use a visual aid showing the Promise and Law so that the girls can follow along)
- Whenever you are explaining a concept, make sure to use visual aids and examples, don't just talk. Include at least 3 different types of visual aids or activities per video
- If you are doing a craft, give the girls step-by-step instructions and provide a sample craft. You should be doing it with them as you are providing instruction and showing them your progress as you go
- For Girl Scout songs, you can get ideas from <u>Girl Scout Songs</u>
